## Joint Statement of UT Austin Faculty Council and Staff Council Leadership Regarding Recent Staff Terminations April 12, 2024

On Tuesday, April 2, 2024 50+ members of the staff were abruptly fired from the University of Texas Austin. The dismissals were framed in the context of SB 17 compliance, suggesting that "additional measures were necessary to reduce overlap, streamline student-facing portfolios, and optimize and redirect resources into our fundamental activities of teaching and research" (President Jay Hartzell, April 2, 2024). Not a single dismissed staff member was working in a DEI space, but rather focusing on learning a new job assignment, as the university had fully complied with SB17 as of January 1, 2024. Several of our dismissed colleagues were awardwinning, some serving more than 25 years at the university, most were from marginalized groups, including LGTBQIA+ and people of color. All were valued for their contributions to UT. We, the leadership of the Staff Council and the Faculty Council, condemn these actions and the political interference they reflect.

The state constitution charges us all with the establishment and maintenance of a "university of the first class." We cannot do so in a climate of disruption, fear, lack of trust, and uncertainty. Political interference in operations of higher education is not a feature of a healthy and functional educational system. We are a community of teachers, researchers, historians, practitioners, lawyers, medical professionals, administrators, and caretakers. Our role is to educate, nurture, prepare, and learn from our students and each other, the proud citizens of Texas, to change the world. As stewards of this university, we are dedicated to maintaining and improving our status as one of the top ranked universities in the nation and the world.

We call on every Texan to support us as we honor the 176 year-long tradition of excellence that is exemplified by the University of Texas at Austin. We wholeheartedly believe the university is large enough to encompass many ideas, many people, and many experiences.
